

14.1 Scoresheet Instructions

The 14.1 statistics worksheet is designed for playing a long game of straight pool, in separate blocks. This is the way Championships were conducted in the past. An example would be a game to 2000 points, played in 100 point blocks.

Fill out the score sheet while the game (or block) is being played.

This is only a portion of the 14.1 scoresheet to give examples. For any inning that ends other than by a missed shot a letter code must be used. An S is entered in the box if a safety was played. An F is used if a Foul occurred.

Inning #1 for Player 1 would represent a successful safe, since the opponent played safe in the bottom half of that inning. Inning #2 for Player 1, and Inning #7 for Player 2 would be a failed safe, since the player that followed was able to make at least one ball on their next shot.
